

#### "Unknown Waters": A floating cinema in Venice, rethinking the city from the perspective of the lagoon

From August 27th, some of the most important local and international cultural organizations that work in the city will be given an opportunity for collective reflection made possible by a unique film festival on the water.

The Cinema Galleggiante, a project conceived by Edoardo Aruta and Paolo Rosso (Microclima), in collaboration with Ocean Space / TBA21-Academy, Pentagram Stiftung and Palazzo Grassi - Punta della Dogana - Pinault Collection, will consist of a series of film screenings on a floating platform, positioned in the middle of the lagoon behind the Giudecca island, close to the Rio of Sant'Eufemia. The program will run from August 27th to September 5th 2020, starting at 7pm. Spectators will be able to watch the screenings with a reservation from their own boats, or from a floating platform designed for members of the public without access to a boat, divided into families in order to respect social distancing.

As the city that invented quarantine, which during some of the most tragic moments of its history witnessed thousands of boats flanking the "lazzaretti", guarantine islands used to accommodate people infected with the plague, Venice is the ideal place for a gesture of thoughtful contemplation, of limited contact, but also of coming together and rebirth.

In response to the period of social and environmental uncertainty that the world is currently experiencing, many initiatives have emerged that recognize the common sense of urgency to come up with new forms of dialogue. As a playful expression of the imagination, and as the archetype of a city in which the fragile relationship between human beings and the environment is ever-present, Venice can act as a catalyst for experimentation and new ideas, which may start locally, but have the potential to create global ripples. So, from August 27th to September 5th, the Cinema Galleggiante initiative will be established in the middle of the lagoon, bringing together for the first time in the city's history some of the best known institutions and cultural organizations, both homegrown and from afar.

In addition to collaboration with our partner organizations, the Cinema Galleggiante has been made possible with the contributions from numerous institutions. Included among the ranks of the historical institutions are Collezione Peggy Guggenheim, Fondazione Querini Stampalia, Fondazione Musei Civici di Venezia - Museo Fortuny, Fondazione Luigi Nono and Università luav di Venezia. Included among the younger organizations are: About, ALMA ZEVI, Awai, DH Office, Festival dei Matti, Galleria Michela Rizzo, Ginko Film, Laguna B & We are here Venice, Spazio Punch e V.E.R-V. . Additionally we have collaborated with some national and international organizations that have a firm connection with Venice: Casa Capra (Schio, VI), Dolomiti Contemporanee (Erto, PN - Borca di Cadore, BL), Lo schermo dell'arte (Florence) and Magazzino Italian Art (New York, USA).

The unique feature of this collective initiative is that both the screen and the audience are on the water, gathered together in a true amphibious setting. The themes of instability, the unexpected, resistance, technological solutions, and the water's potential for creating routes for transport and communication inform the theme of the film festival: Unknown Waters. Partner institutions and both local and international organizations have been asked to offer films (feature films, short films or art films) linked to these issues, with the aim of bringing out a collective vision. In terms of programming, a collective decision was made to alternate between local and international directors and artists, both young and well-established.

Among the selected creators are: Antoni Muntadas, Eames Office, Lina Wertmüller, Mariano Fortuny y Madrazo, Peter Brook, Peter Greenaway & Michael Nyman, Superstudio, Werner Herzog, and Zbigniew Rybczynski.

Among the international artists are: Giorgio Andreotta Calò, Jennifer Baichwal & Edward Burtynsky, Petrit Halilaj and Alvaro Urbano, Pierre Huyghe, Margarida Mendes, Mariateresa Sartori, and Melissa McGill. And finally there will be two premieres: the SUPERFLEX group will be screening Hunga Tonga for the very first time, while twenty-fouryear-old director Lance Oppenheim, who will present Some Kind of Heaven for the first time in Italy at the Cinema Galleggiante, after the world premiere at the 2020 Sundance Film Festival (Park City, Utah).

There is also an extensive list of selected artists and filmmakers that work in and around Venice: Nicola Baratto and Yiannis Mouravas, Sergio Bertani, Antonella Campisi and Daniele Zoico, Daniele Costa, Andrea De Fusco, Etimo Production, Valentina Furian, Furio Ganz and Matilde Sambo, Johannes Menghi with Tommaso Bagnati and Francesco La Porta, Giovanni Pellegrini and Caterina Erica Shanta.



In parallel with the programme of screenings, the Cinema Galleggiante will offer a diverse series of artistic events.

The first evening will open with Ulisse Trabacchin, "Associate Chorus Master" of the choir at the Teatro alla Scala in Milan, who will improvise on the piano accompanied by images shot by Mariano Fortuny y Madrazo in the early 1900s.

Using a magic lantern from the late 1800s, the lanternist Gianni Trotter will follow by leading the audience through a pre-cinema show based on traveling and exploring unknown places, curated by the Gli Impresari collective.

The V.E.R-V. group, established on the Giudecca in 2019, will offer a musical performance at sunset. The schedule also includes a presentation by Professor Sara Marini from luav University of Venice entitled Vesper: Peripheral glances of Venice, and the writer Alberto Toso Fei will contribute with a piece entitled Stories at dusk.

The II Calcio, Soralai, and Soto Aqua associations will be providing rowing boats for the logistical operations, and will be escorting the public from Cantiere Chia to the floating platform and delivering orders made at the kiosk.

Venice Calls, an organization started in 2019 to promote sustainability, volunteering, and innovation, will be actively involved in the logistical organization of the Cinema Galleggiante.

The catering service that will be available is born from a collaboration between Hamed Ahmadi's Africa Experience and Marco Bravetti's TOCIA! The former is a restaurant composed of a team of migrants who recreate the recipes of the diaspora, while the latter is an experimental platform for social cuisine started by a chef with experience working in international avant-garde restaurants.

# Cinema Galleggiante | Unknown Waters

August 27, 30, 31; September 1, 3, 4, 5, 2020 From 7pm to 11pm Giudecca, Venice

Free event, reservations required on www.cinemagalleggiante.it starting from August 20th. For members of the public without access to a boat, contributions towards the boat transfers will be expected.

#### How to get there

By foot: from the Giuecca Palanca vaporetto stop, turn right and take the first street on the left, Calle lunga dell'Accademia dei Nobili, at the end of which (after around 250 meters) you will find the entrance to the Chia boatyard, the reception for the event.

By boat: the Cinema Galleggiante is located in the shallow area adjacent to the Retro Giudecca Canal, close to the Rio de Sant'Eufemia canal. Arriving from Zattere, take the Rio de Sant'Eufemia canal, between the eponymous church and Harry's Dolci. At the end of the canal, on the left, you will find the reception at the Chia boatyard. If you already have your mooring number, proceed directly towards the Cinema Galleggiante. Arriving from the Retro Giudecca Canal, the floating cinema is located in the shallow area opposite the Chia and Manin boatyards.
